

Redwood Lodge Farm, Ellington Thorpe

Originally owned by the Duke of Manchester, this 280 acre farm is sited on the heavy clay hills of Ellington Thorpe. The four bedroomed red brick farmhouse, with a slated roof, is sited half a mile to the east, down the lane on the top of Grafham Hill. In 1906 Mark Frost was the tenant farmer of Redwood and later, in 1918, purchased the farm from the Duke, but not Sparrows Spinney. Round about 1936, the farmhouse was gutted by fire and has never been lived in since. To this day the house is just a shell. Thompson Wales purchased the farm before World War 2 and listed in the 1940 Kelly's Directory telephone Buckden 266. At this time, my father Bert Malt was working on the farm and was called up in early 1940. Mr and Mrs Wales lived in the cottage next to

Sparrow's Spinney on the top of Grafham Hill. Sam Malt and Douglas King demolished these cottages in the early 1960s for Mr A Nicholls. During the war years the War Ag (War Agriculture Executive Committee) farmed part of the farm. In October 1956, Mr Arnold Nicholls purchased Redwood and later Sparrows Spinney, in the 1970s. The Nicholls family sold to John Brotherton in November 1998.

PARISH NEWS..

July 2011

The Parish Council received a request from Brampton Parish Council for a contribution towards the costs of installing a new pedestrian access to Brampton Wood. The proposal is expected to improve the network of paths and create a circular route for villagers of Grafham, Brampton and Ellington. The Wildlife Trust are likely to agree to installing a kissing gate at a cost of £300. The Council agreed to contribute £100 towards this cost.

Cllr Downes has offered his support in furthering the proposals to improve road safety on the bend at the junction of Breach and Buckden Roads. It was agreed that this is a dangerous, blind bend and traffic speeds should be controlled on the approaches. Another step to bringing the matter forward could be to raise a petition of Grafham residents. A request from the PC to improve signage and road markings at the junction of Church Hill and Church Road is apparently being given a sympathetic hearing.

Cllr Downes also talked to the Council about plans in some areas to deliver transport in the community. Such schemes could involve mini-buses or private cars. He also suggested that steps to counter "rural isolation" suffered by some elderly people could be considered and "networking" lists drawn up.

The sub-committee set up to investigate the possibilities for improving facilities at the village hall have had a meeting to discuss initial thoughts and ideas. The AGM of the Village Hall Management Committee will be taking place at the village hall on Tuesday 19th July and it is expected that further discussions will take place there. If you have any input for the committees, please come along and join in the discussions.

The Village Plan is on the Grafham Village website. If you are interest in the results please visit the site, where you can get full details.

The Youth Connection bus is coming to Grafham. Keep an eye on the notice boards to find out where and when.

If you have views you would like to air on any of the above issues, the Parish Council will be pleased to hear from you.

There is no meeting of the Council in August. The date of the next meeting will be 13th September 2011.

Grafham Cricket Club

Playing Bedford Park 2 and Bedford Park under a sun and showers sky was Tom Chester's first experience of being captain of Grafham Cricket Club. Bedford Park 2 won the toss, and their openers were soon among the runs, but Tim Hollick's taking of a wicket just when the match appeared at this early stage to be running away from Grafham, changed the tempo of the game. Steady bowling by Tom and his brother Matt steadied the scoring rate and the replacement of Tom Chester by Gareth Knowles changed the Bedford Park 2 innings. Gareth's 6 overs cost 44 runs, but he took 5 wkts and with Duncan Palmer taking a wicket with his first ball, saw Bedford Park 2 finish on 188 all out.



Grafham's batting this season has either been golden or leaden; today it was golden, with Tom Chester and Duncan Palmer scoring at a blistering pace. The first wicket falling at 116 with Tom Chester on 68; hitting eleven, 4s and one 6 gave the initia-

tive to Grafham. An innings of 44 from Duncan Palmer and Josh Owen 32 not out saw Grafham home on 189 for 5: Tom's first victory as captain!



Next week saw Graham's annual match with Lockton in North Yorkshire. Hard to believe the match was played under an azure sky, with barely a hint of a cloud: a Yorkshire day without the threat of rain, hard for a southerner to believe.

Grafham opened the batting and scored steadily, until Rob Forsdick came to the wicket and hit five 6s in his innings; top scoring on 48 not out, backed by Gareth Knowles 31 not out, and Chris Dighton 32, with Grafham finishing on 205 for 8.

Lockton's reply after the loss of two early wickets was also steady and behind the asking rate, until their last batsman came in and knocked 28 in quick order, making it 3 to win off the last ball. Thankfully a hard hit single to Long On, meant that Grafham won by just 2 runs. A highly enjoyable and friendly game; graced in the interval by a tasty filling Yorkshire cricket tea; another memorable cricketing day in Yorkshire.

We are very happy to welcome any visitors and holidaymakers in Grafham to any of our services. We love to see new faces.

A Shepherd's Tale July 2011

July has been a very quiet month with some much needed rain freshening up the grass, but we could still do with more. The lambs have enjoyed the dry weather and kept growing and as a result I have just sent our first batch off to the butcher. I had been hanging on to them so we could get performance recording data from them, but they were getting too big and taking few lambs away releases grazing for the others. We have also weaned the first batch of lambs; their mothers were not giving much milk. It was interesting to note that it was the mothers who minded losing their lambs rather than viceversa. One ewe has been particularly noisy with a very persistent and long bleat. She kept going most of the first night so was moved to a further field so we get some sleep.

As harvest approaches we are already planning next tupping season and looking at which ewes we should cull. At long last I have bitten the bullet and decided that two ewes who persistently suffer from a prolapse must go. I have been a bit reluctant to let them go as one was one of the first ewes I bought, whilst the other is proba-



bly the tamest, but they are a pending disaster as there is a much greater risk of the whole uterus coming out at lambing. This will result in a huge vet's bill and most probably a dead ewe. To make up for this I have treated myself to two new shearlings from one of the top flocks. They are due to arrive this weekend. We are also trying to get everything ship-shape (sheep-shape surely!) as later in August we are hosting an open evening and farm walk for commercial sheep farmers.



Report on Neighbourhood Watch Meeting June 21st


